London Open Gardens

Organised by London Parks & Gardens Trust. Over 100 gardens take part, including many that are usually closed to the public. There are themed guides online to help you plan your visits. Weekend pass required. Cost: £20. £15 for early birds! Some gardens open by ballot only.



Open House Festival 14 to 22 September 2024

Over 800 buildings open during the festival, often including residential roof top spaces not usually accessible Open House attracts around 400,000 people. Booking advised.

National Garden Scheme - London

A fantastic way to explore small gardens across London. Private gardens open throughout the summer. Many gardens are opened as groups in a local area, so you can visit several gardens in an afternoon. Search online or download the London list of participating gardens from the NGS website to plan your visit. There is a small entry fee for each garden, with all profits being given to health related charities. In 2023, the National Garden Scheme donated mover £3.4m to charities, including Maggie's, Horatio's Garden and the Carers' Trust.
